Through frosty window glass, we are reminded that winter is fully here, even in the GTA. Some days are beautifully white and quiet. Other days are grey and slushy. We are proud Canadians: we bundle up, grab our Tim's, and wait for the sun to come back out. In many ways, that is winter at YWS. There is much to celebrate and much to push through. If you ever have the chance to visit us, and I hope you do, you will see just how deeply committed our team is.

Over the past three months, our shelter was almost always at full capacity (53 beds). Our emergency program welcomed 24 new youth seeking a safe place, and we helped 17 residents move into stable housing. Our team supported 13 youth in finding employment and distributed 84 food packages to former residents. We provided 513 hours of case management support and 204 mental health counselling sessions.

All of this makes the gloomy, slushy days brighter. On those days when youth are reminded that this bed and this home are temporary, when they miss family, friends, and having a place of their own, they also know they are surrounded by people who care. This year, snowflakes were also inside our shelter. We decorated windows with snowflakes bearing our donors' first names, so our youth could see just how many people hold them in their hearts. Because of you, they experienced a peaceful holiday season filled with laughter and gifts. Because of you, there is now a lively Monopoly game around the dining room table each day. Because of you, some of our residents stepped onto the ice and skated for the very first time.

Thank you for turning slush into snow, for turning gloom into light, and for keeping true community warmth alive in our shelter. From our home to yours, we hope our snowflakes touch your hearts too.

I cannot thank our donors and volunteers enough for making this season our most successful yet. This year, **12 benefactors** stepped forward to support our matching campaign. Together, with your generosity, we raised **\$772,917** through our Home for the Holidays campaign.

What makes this initiative especially meaningful is how it inspires giving beyond the campaign itself. I am thrilled to share that in just the last two months, a total of **\$1,490,874** was raised in support of YWS.
